### Summary:

On Friday, December 21st, 2018, at 4:09 pm, San Mateo County Sheriff's Office deputies from the Millbrae Police Bureau responded to the 10-100 block of Cozzolino Drive in Millbrae regarding a package theft that just occurred.

Upon arrival, deputies learned three suspects were seen taking packages from several residences and were still in the area. When the suspects saw the deputies, they ran into the backyards of nearby residences. With the assistance of San Bruno Police Department and San Mateo County Transit Deputies, a systematic search of the immediate area was done and Ramon Ulloa was located and placed under arrest for the above-mentioned charges. Ramon Ulloa was in possession of property from a residence that had just been burglarized. The two other suspects still need to be identified.

This is an ongoing investigation and San Mateo County Sheriff's detectives are following up on all leads. The below photographs are of the suspects who still need to be identified.
